After the Men's Retreat in December we began to get ready to receive mission teams that would be arriving during January 2015, through our AWARE Program, which stands for Alternative Workstudy and Reality Experience, members mission experienced awareness of the rural reality and needs of villagers while giving them an opportunity to respond to hunger and poverty through their service at our "Tree of Life" Training Center and surrounding rural communities in Mexico.

During January 2<sup>nd</sup> through January 10<sup>th</sup>, it was a pleasure to receive members from Tabernacle UMC in Virginia, Northridge UMC and San Luis Obispo UMC in California.



They worked side by side with the local villagers preparing the land to receive seeds and planted them, rebuilt a barn roof improving its' structure for the livestock, hauled the rubble from under the roof, began to build a stone floor for a new sightseeing devotional area, repaired the roof of the chicken's pen, painted murals for our livestock devotion area, and repaired a mud grass wall leaving distinctive sculptures

within it. These were only some of the tasks they had. Preaching at the local church, leading the praise, collecting the offering, providing Three King's Day gifts to the children at UMC "Getsemani", and spending fellowship time with the local villagers of the congregation were blessed experiences for everyone. They saw how our GYTTE Health workers covered the topic of HIV-AIDS, (Their meaning, HIV transmission, Myths, Prevention Couples, Prevention of Mother to Child, including their particular treatment) as they educated the rural sector "El Limon" and provided AIDS preventive (condoms pregnancy tests) to them.







The emphasis was placed on prevention, early detection and information of public rural governmental health agencies that can offer them testing, treatment, appropriate prenatal care and psychological counseling. Touring Puebla and the Pyramids of "Teotihuacán" was breathtaking. How else could the mission AWARE members contrast rural and urban Mexican lifestyles. Enjoy seeing their moments of hard work, labor and leisure.

January 16<sup>th</sup> the second AWARE Team arrived from Belmont UMC, Nashville Tennessee with members from Virginia and Florida.

The mayor interest of this AWARE Team was to learn local environmentally sound technologies they could share with local churches. These churches then could collaborate with their surrounding communities and countries as well.

They were educated on: the use and construction of the dry composting toilet, fuel -efficient mud stove, solar oven, vermiculture, compost-express, the square foot garden and recycled paper. Take a look at the on hand experiences they had with these technologies. They also replaced a barn roof improving it's structure for the livestock, milked cows and goats. Women gathered wood for our fuel efficient stove. Others continued to build the rock floor for the new sightseeing devotional area. Since this floor was built from scratch many trips to the river to gather rocks was an integral part of its' construction. The AWARE team members provided support to our health workers that were educating a rural community on Dental Hygiene and applying fluoride to its' participants. The AWARE team mingled with the villagers as they distributed primary dental items to villagers that attended. Touring Puebla's local touristic landmarks allowed the team to have a balance between hard labor and leisure time. Take a look!
